
Moving Forward

Tools for Success









Teach how to do group work

- Faculty training
- Shared course for 1st year students
- Devote entire class (or more) to the process of group work

Create Relevance

- Discuss why the project is being assigned
 - Industry
 - Teamwork
- Present real industry situations
- Discuss goals and outcomes that will be achieved

Group Formation – Teacher selected

- Quick student survey
- Strengths











Group Formation – Student Selected

- Team leads
- Professional interests



 Give them time to think about skills needed



Planning and Operation of Group Work

- Create a contract
 - Define roles & procedures



- Provide students with a comprehensive outline
- Monitor the group work



Evaluation Process

- Individual or Group Grade or both
 - Weighting of the grade
- Peer Evaluations
- Grading throughout the semester
